Bill Eddins, State Attorney for the First Judicial Circuit of Florida, announced today that Kona Keoki Mai has been sentenced to 15 years prison on the charges of Trafficking in Fentanyl, Trafficking in Methamphetamine and Possession of a Firearm by a Convicted Felon. The 15 year sentence is a minimum mandatory sentence, which means that he will not be eligible for early release and must serve the entire sentence.

The charges were the result of the execution of a search warrant at a house located at 393 Lowery Place in Fort Walton Beach. During the search, large amounts of Methamphetamine and Fentanyl were discovered in a safe. A stolen AR-15 rifle and handgun were also located in the home. Mai admitted to ownership of all the drugs and firearms located.

The Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office was responsible for the investigation and arrest. Assistant State Attorney Jennifer Flowers was responsible for the prosecution of the cases. Circuit Judge John Gontarek imposed the sentence.
