PRESS RELEASE

Ginger Bowden Madden, State Attorney for the First Judicial Circuit of Florida, announces that on November 16, 2021, Lloyd Christopher Lister was sentenced by Circuit Court Judge Linda Nobles to thirty years in Florida's Department of Corrections, ten years of which must be served as a mandatory minimum prison sentence pursuant to Florida's 10-20-Life law.

On August 19, 2021, an Escambia County jury found the Defendant guilty of Home Invasion Robbery with a Firearm, False Imprisonment with a Firearm, and Grand Theft Auto.

On December 20, 2020, the Defendant entered the victim's home wearing a mask and armed with a firearm. The Defendant pointed the firearm at the victim and her daughter and demanded the victim's wallet, cellphone, computer tablet, and car keys. The victim and her daughter recognized the Defendant's voice to be that of the daughter's ex-boyfriend, Lloyd Lister. The Defendant and the victim's daughter then fled the scene in the victim's car.

At the sentencing hearing, Assistant State Attorney Blake Adams argued, "the Defendant took more than just the victim's personal belongings. He took her sense of safety, security, and independence that everyone should feel when inside their own home."
